When it was published in 1973, E.F. Schumacher's book, *Small Is Beautiful: Economics as if People Mattered*, made a lot of people think about the ways we make money, and what we use it for. Here is a quote taken from the book:

"A modern economist is used to measuring the 'standard of living' by the amount of annual consumption, assuming all the time that a man who consumes more is 'better off' than a man who consumes less. In 1983, Cyndi Lauper reached the top of the charts with her hit song "Girls Just Want to Have Fun." These days, the same could be said for millions of men and women in their 20s, 30s, and even 40s. These so-called "kidults" dress and behave like children. Refusing to grow up, they often live with their parents, play video games, and watch cartoons. Observers point to positive and negative **ramifications** of the trend, which is all about having fun and avoiding, at all costs, the "R" word: Responsibility.

The word "kidult" is a combination of "kid" and "adult." Kidults often live with their parents long after finishing high school and college. It's a fast-growing trend. In 1970, only 11% of American 26-year-olds lived with their parents, but by 2005, that figure had grown to 20%. Likewise, people are getting married and having children later. In Ireland, for instance, the average marriage age rose from 30.7 in 2000 to 32.6 in 2005.

Facts like these have led some observers to suggest that people are growing up later and later. Rather than finding a steady job, getting married, and taking out a mortgage, many people are opting for a different path. They're staying put, taking whatever work comes along, and devoting their disposable income to having a good time.

Though we can't stop time, the maturation process does seem to be slowing down. As daily life becomes more complex, it's taking people longer to learn to live independently, so the traditional idea that adulthood starts at 18 may soon be a thing of the past. That holds true for countries as diverse as Japan, Germany, and Canada. So, to all those adults with Hello Kitty T-shirts and toy robots, take heart. You've got plenty of company.
